## Code of Conduct for Young Cricketers

Haywards Heath Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its young cricketers.

Haywards Heath Cricket Club believes that it is important that its young cricketers, members, coaches, administrators and parents/carers associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, young cricketers and their parents/carers are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with **Nick Gracie-Langrick (Chairman)**, **Rachel Smith (Child Safeguarding Officer)** or **Dave Woodfield (Colts Manager)**.

As a junior member of Haywards Heath Cricket Club, you are expected to abide by the following code of conduct for young cricketers:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and matches/competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late – This includes arriving in good time to help in preparing the ground for home games, and staying after games/practice to ensure that all equipment is put away and the ground is left tidy.
- All members are expected to treat the Clubs facilities (changing rooms, nets and the ground) and, when playing away, those of our hosts, with care and respect.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
