Vinylsessions

Vinylsessions is a community fundraising group inspired by a shared love of music and vinyl records. Wanting to make a difference for local families, the group chose to support HHCC and set themselves an ambitious fundraising target.

Through a series of regular music events supported by local sponsors and attendees, Vinylsessions raised over £10,000 to refurbish the parent and family bathroom facilities within the Special Care Baby Unit (SCBU) at Harrogate District Hospital. Their fundraising has helped create a more comfortable environment for families spending time on the unit.

The group has also supported children's services by funding a visit from Father Christmas to the children's wards.

Jack's Story

After being diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer, Jack was supported by Active Against Cancer (AAC) throughout his recovery.

Wanting to give back to the service that had supported him, Jack took on the Sir Chris Hoy Tour de 4 Cycle Ride, cycling 56 miles to raise funds for AAC, Jack raised an incredible £2,579.

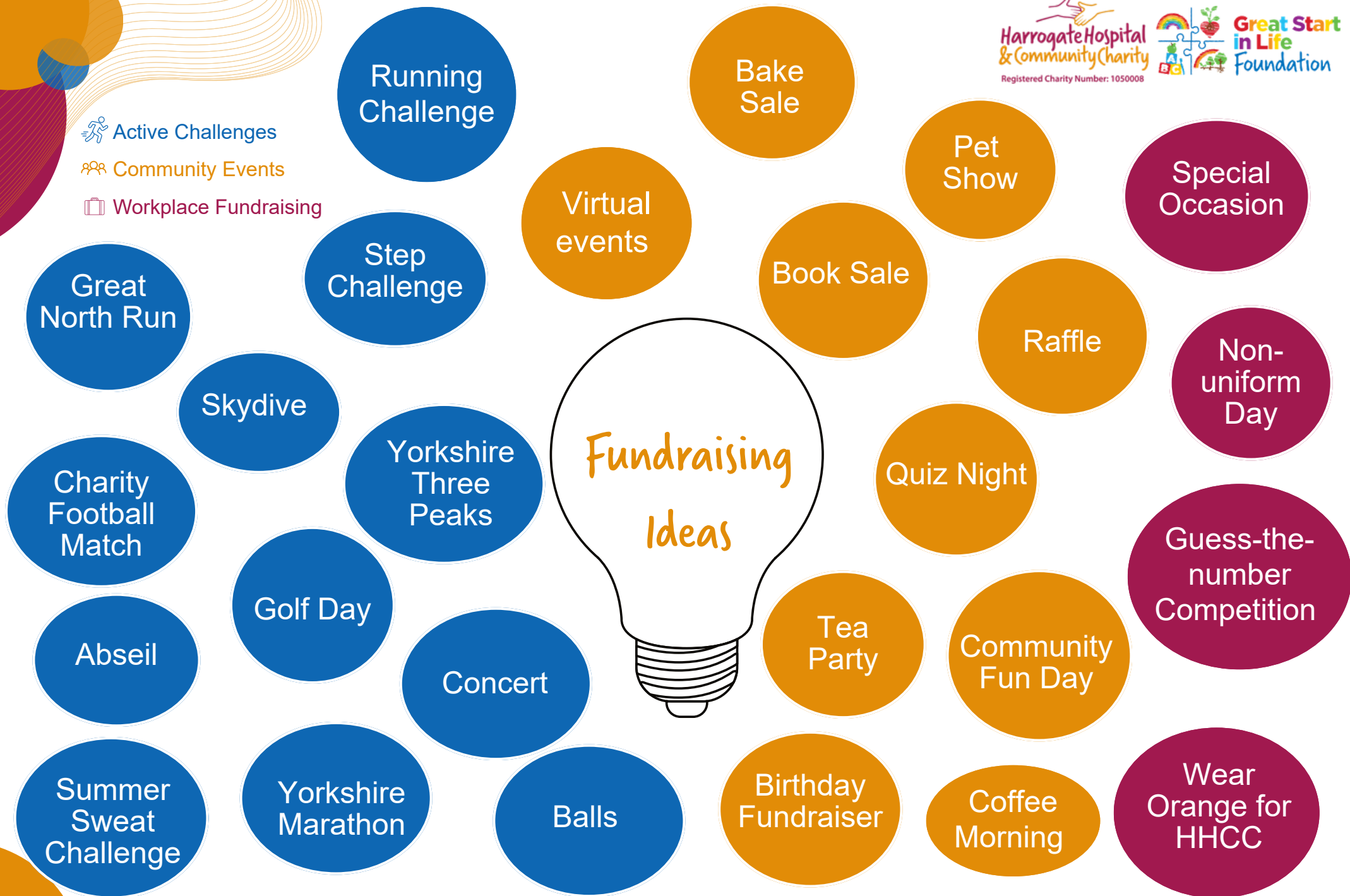
Jack said:

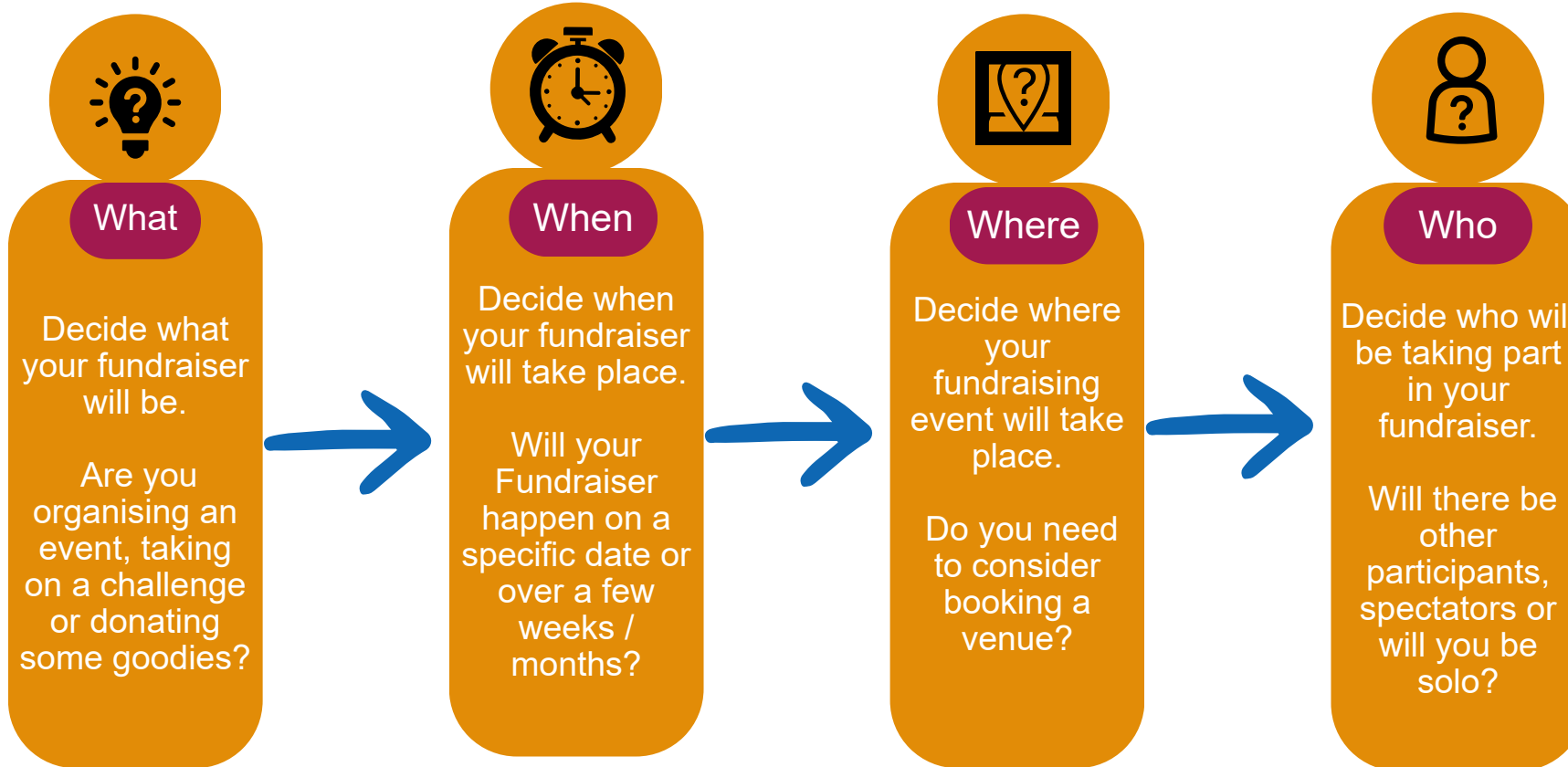

offline Fundraising

Offline Fundraising is useful on the day of a Fundraising event or if you or your Supporters do not have access to online fundraising.

Some methods of Offline Fundraising can be used during the run up to your Fundraiser.

Useful offline Fundraising Methods:

Cash Donation – Can be sent via bank transfer or brought to the trust please contact the HHCC team to request this.

Collecting Tins/Bucket – You can borrow HHCC Collecting Tins to collect donations when you are fundraising

Did you know you can boost your donation by 25% for every £1 you donate through *giftaid it*

Important Information

Raffles:

- Raffles and Lotteries fall under gambling law and regulations please adhere to the [Gambling Commission](#) for advice
- Any raffle that does not get drawn on the same day as tickets being sold tickets must be officially printed. These tickets must have specific information to adhere to the gambling laws and regulations such as: the name and home address of the Fundraiser organising the raffle (this must be the Fundraiser's details).
- If you are organising a raffle it is your responsibility to ensure you are compliant with the law. If in doubt, contact the HHCC Team

Health & Safety:

Some or all points may be relevant to your Fundraiser. Please ensure you have: Please contact the fundraising team if you are unsure

- First aid cover & risk assessment
- Food – please visit [Food Standards Agency](#) for more information. All food vendors used in events must provide you with a copy of their public liability insurance and food hygiene certificate
- Public Liability Insurance
- Licenses – if serving alcohol or playing live music – check with your local authority
- Collections – you need written permission from the local authority, the person responsible for the venue, and collectors must be over 16
- Public material when fundraising for HHCC make sure you include our registered charity number (1050008) on any documents / advertisement
- **If you are unsure about any of the above, please contact the HHCC Team before proceeding.**

Things to Avoid When Fundraising:

- Don't be afraid to ask questions. The HHCC Team are here to support you, no matter how big or small your question is.
- Don't feel like you have to fundraise alone. Get your friends and family involved and remember that the HHCC Team are here to support you too.
- Please do not shake collection tins or buckets, as this is not permitted under fundraising regulations.
- Avoid activities that could put you, your participants or HHCC at risk. If you are unsure whether something is safe or appropriate, please contact the HHCC Team before going ahead.

After your Fundraiser:

- After your Fundraiser has finished contact the HHCC Team and share your experience and photos. We would love to see them and thank you for all your support.
